1.	Form your business. □
	1.1. Review formation options in New Hampshire. \Box
	There are six main types of business entities in New Hampshire. Choose the
	one that suits your business best.
	1.2. Name your business. □
	After checking to see your name does not exist, register your business name
	with the Secretary of State's Office.
	1.3. Get an Employer Identification Number. \square
	Apply for an EIN with the IRS.
	1.4. Register your business in New Hampshire. \square
	Sole proprietorships do not need to file with the state. Partnerships need to
	file their partnership agreement. LLCs and corporations must file online.
	1.5. Obtain necessary permits and licenses. \square
	Check the New Hampshire government Online Licensing page to see if your
	business requires any special licenses. If you do, apply for them online.
2.	Register your business for taxes. □
	2.1. Register for corporate income tax. □
	Register your business online with the New Hampshire Secretary of State
	Corporate Division.
	2.2. Register for Business Enterprise Tax. □
	Register your business online with the New Hampshire Secretary of State
	Corporate Division.

	2.3. Register for Unemployment Compensation Tax. □
	Register your business online with the New Hampshire Employment Security
	Bureau.
3.	Hire employees and report them to the state. \Box
	3.1. Purchase workers' compensation insurance. \Box
	Buy this insurance coverage from an insurance company you trust. Put up the
	compliance poster where your employees can see it.
	3.2. Report new hires to the Employment Security Bureau. \Box
	Provide the necessary information for each and every new employee, rehire,
	and contractor online.
